Uday arrives with the *baraat* — a procession with a live band that everyone joins. The ceremony follows, then dinner and celebrations.

INDIAN WEAR GLOSSARY

Not familiar with Indian clothing? Here's a quick guide to some of the styles you might see on our dress code guide



LEHENGA

A three-piece outfit consisting of a long skirt, a fitted blouse and a dupatta (a draped scarf)

Perfect for: The Sangeet, The Ceremony



SHERWANI

A formal, embroidered knee-length coat worn by men with fitted trousers

Perfect for: The Sangeet, The Ceremony



SAREE

A long piece of fabric that is wrapped and draped around the body, worn with a fitted blouse underneath

Perfect for: The Ceremony



ANARKALI

A long, tunic-style dress worn over trousers, usually with a dupatta

Perfect for: The Mehendi, The Lunch



SHARARA

A kurta paired with wide, flared trousers, usually paired with a dupatta

Perfect for: The Mehendi, The Lunch



KURTA

A versatile tunic worn with trousers, from casual cotton styles to more formal versions
